Professore ordinario dal 1° novembre 2000, dal 1° novembre del 2004 sino al 13 dicembre 2021 ha prestato servizio, presso la facoltà di Giurisprudenza dell'Università di Napoli "Federico II", dove è stato titolare dell'insegnamento di Diritto commerciale oltre ad aver assunto, per supplenza, nel corso degli anni, anche la titolarità degli insegnamenti di Diritto delle assicurazioni, di Diritto industriale e di Diritto della navigazione. Dal 14 dicembre 2021 è in servizio presso il Dipartimento di Giurisprudenza dell'Università di Roma Tor Vergata, dove è attualmente titolare degli insegnamenti di Diritto della crisi di impresa e di Diritto della concorrenza

He trained professionally with Prof. Berardino Libonati, in whose law firm he worked until 2006. He is enrolled in the register of lawyers at the Council of the Order of Rome since August 8, 1994. Since March 10, 2001 he is also qualified to practice before the Court of Cassation and other higher jurisdictions.

Formerly a researcher in commercial law at the Faculty of Law of the University of Urbino from 1996 to 1998, after obtaining the title of associate professor, from November 1, 1998 he took over the teaching of Commercial law at the Faculty of Economics of the University of Florence, where he worked until October 31, 2004. At the Faculty of Economics of the same University, in the three-year period 1998-2000, he held the chair of the teaching of Insurance law. Full professor since November 1, 2000, from November 1, 2004 until December 13, 2021 he worked at the Faculty of Law of the University of Naples "Federico II", where he was professor of Commercial law, in addition to having taken over, as a substitute, over the years, the teaching of Insurance law, Industrial law and Shipping law. Since December 14, 2021 he has been working at the Department of Law of the University of Rome Tor Vergata, where he is currently teaching Bankruptcy Law and Competition Law.

In the past, he has held important management positions on the boards of directors of listed companies, in particular Assicurazioni Generali in 2003-2004. On appointment by the Bank of Italy he was a member of the supervisory committee of Banca delle Marche S.p.A. in extraordinary administration and Medio Leasing S.p.A. in extraordinary administration. He is currently a member of the Board of Directors of Atlantia S.p.A., as director appointed from the minority list submitted by institutional investors.

From 1 October 2009 to 15 October 2015, he was a member, appointed by Confindustria, of the Arbitro Bancario Finanziario (Naples panel), an adr body set up by the Bank of Italy for the out-of-court settlement of disputes on banking matters. Since December 19, 2016 he has been a member, by designation of the Associations of Financial Intermediaries (Assogestioni and
